Are you already one step towards your next NEBOSH Certificate?

Unit NGC1 of this qualification (Management of health and safety) is common to the NEBOSH National General Certificate, the National Certificate in Construction and the National Certificate in Fire Safety and Risk Management. You do not have to sit Unit NGC1 again if you have passed it within the last five years.



How is the course assessed?

Candidates are assessed with written examinations for each of the two taught units in addition to the fire safety risk assessment.

A unit certificate is issued denoting successful achievement of each unit. A certificate parchment is issued on successful achievement of the two units and the practical assessment.

Where can I take a course leading to the NEBOSH Certificate?

Details of training providers that represent NEBOSH throughout the world are on our website. These training providers offer courses to fit around your requirements:

- Distance or blended learning
- Day or evening courses over a number of weeks
- Block release or modular courses
